Before you begin:

Print photos, timeline, cause and effect chart, and OPTIC activity instructions

Introduction

Explain the contraband decision.

Overview of the Contraband decision: The Confederates were using slaves to help them in the war effort. Three men (Shepherd Mallory, Frank Baker, and James Townsend) refused and escaped to Fort Monroe. This led to the Contraband decision, which led to tens of thousands of enslaved people to seek refuge with the Union Army.


Show photo of Gen. Butler with Mallory, Baker & Townsend (Appendix A). Students will do an <u>OPTIC analysis</u> chart on the picture.

Pre-Reading Activity

Draw conclusions about why General Butler might have agreed to accept these men as contraband.

Based on the intro information about the Contraband Decision and the photo, create a comic strip detailing what the men are discussing.



Read the Book

While reading, students will write down effects of the Contraband Decision based on information in the book

After Reading (Choose 1 or more)

CAUSE & EFFECT DIAGRAM –Student groups will work together to create a cause and effect diagram. Each group should have a copy of the book.

NOTICE & WONDER CHART: Student groups will be given photos of Slabtown from the Library of Congress (Appendix B). Ask them to write down what they notice and wonder about the town created near Fort Monroe.

NOTICE & WONDER CHART: Student groups will be given photos of "Reliable Contraband" from the Library of Congress (Appendix C). Ask them to write down what they notice and wonder about this photo.

• Create a timeline of Fort Monroe and the Contraband Decision


